Home Learning

Act of Worship theme next week:

It is science week in the first week back. In preparation we would like you to explore your back garden or a local park area if your garden doesn't lend itself to this learning opportunity.

Below are a number of things you can do linked with plants and mini beasts. Please **choose one activity from the list** and have a go at it. You can record your findings anyway you choose (picture, a piece of writing, photograph with annotations, brain storm/mind map) and be prepared to share what you have discovered with the other children in your class.

- 1. Discover the grasses in your garden- Find different types of grasses in your garden. What is the most common type of grass in your garden? You could record this in a table (A piece of the grass, its name, description etc......)
- 2. Most popular plant- Find as many different flowers/plants/ weeds in your garden. What grows well in your garden and what is the most common one? Can you suggest why these particular plants like it in your garden? Is your garden sunny? Shady?
- 3. Crazy leaves-Pick leaves from trees (ask your parents first please) or use ones that are already on the ground. Sort the leaves into matching shapes and stick them on paper. Are there any similarities between the shapes of the leaves from the big trees or small trees? Are there any that appear to have a lot of insects living on them? (With any leftover leaves you can make up little creatures by sticking them on the paper and adding a head and legs? What type of animals can you create out of the leaves?)
- 4. Most popular mini beast- Find as many different creepy crawlies in your garden as you can. What mini-beasts like it in your garden? What is the most common mini-beast? Can you think of reasons why this particular creature likes to live in your garden? Is your garden dark? Sunny?

As always please continue to practise your times tables and make sure you are reading regularly at home.
