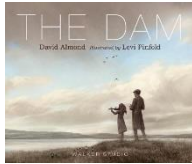


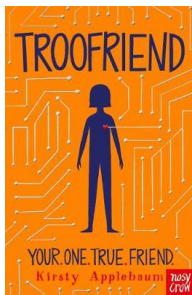
## Recommended Reads Year 6 2020-21

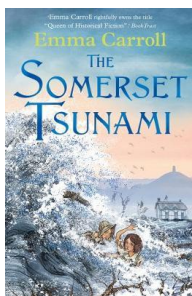

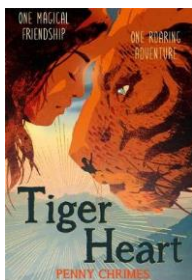
### **Carroll, Emma      The Somerset Tsunami**

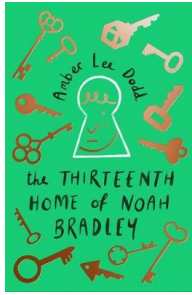

### **Chrimes, Penny      Tiger Heart**

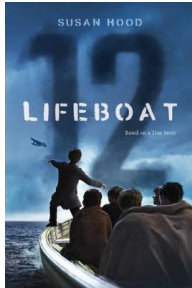

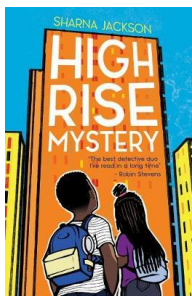
**Dodd, Amber Lee      The Thirteenth Home of Noah Bradley      CF**

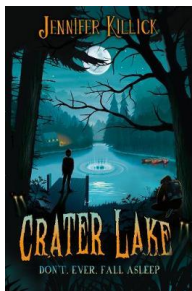
**Hood, Susan      Lifeboat 12      CF**

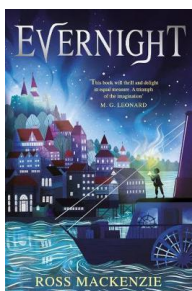
**Jackson, Sharna      High Rise Mystery      T**

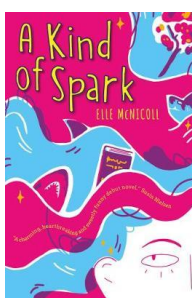
**Killick, Jennifer      Crater Lake      CF**

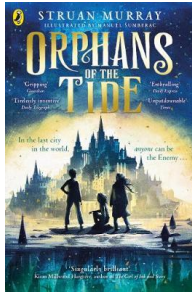
**MacKenzie, Ross      Evernight      CF**

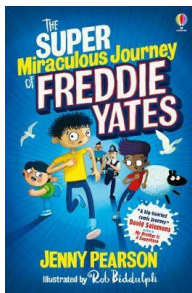

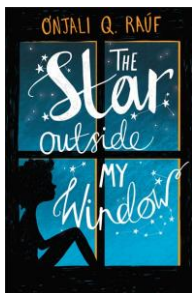

A great story for bravery and resilience, this is set in occupied France during WWII. Will Joelle be able to survive the horrors of the war around her?

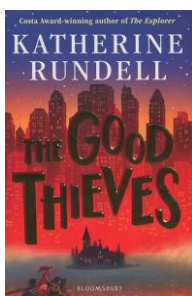

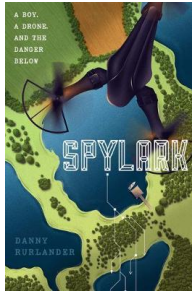


**Rundell, Katherine The Good Thieves**

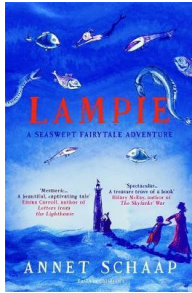




**Rurlander, Danny    Spylark**

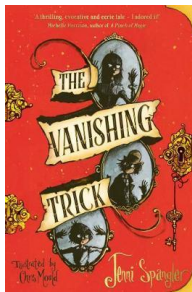

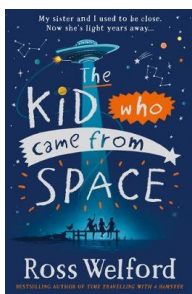
**Spangler, Jenni    The Vanishing Trick**

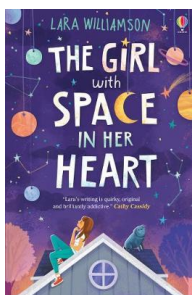
**Welford, Ross    The Kid Who Came from Space**
