Dear Parents & Carers,

Last week year 4 enjoyed a day trip to Venice as part of their Geography topic, the smells from their food tasting were lovely!

Year 5 have almost finished their swimming lessons, with their last session straight after half term. It has been good to hear how many of those who were nonswimmers at the start of half term, can now swim and to hear about the improvement in stroke technique others have made.

We have ended this half term looking at the value of Respect in our Act of Worships. During this week each class will complete work related to a specific picture book. This year we will also be having a sponsored read to raise money for much needed replacement books in our library.
