Safeguarding updates – Online Safety

We have seen an increase in the number of children who tell us they have created YouTube accounts and many children say they frequently watch videos on YouTube on their devices at home.

The dangers of sharing videos are explained to the children in our Online Safety lessons, and children know they should be 13+ to create a YouTube account of their own. We strongly recommend this is adhered to.

However, we understand that many children see YouTuber as a career goal, and view creating a channel as the first steps to achieve this. YouTube Kids is a safer option, but still requires contributors to be 13+. Here is a useful guide to support safe use of YouTube as a viewer and a contributor:
