Last week I helped welcome prospective parents of children currently in year 2. They were thoroughly impressed, as was I, with the year 6 pupil pairs who took them round the school for a 15min visit. It was heartwarming to see how well behaved, polite and proud of their school they were.

Mrs Lillywhite and Mr Gibbs then did a presentation that showed St Mary's in its best light of course, but they mentioned that despite receiving an outstanding rating from Ofsted, they certainly didn't rest on their laurels and are striving to constantly improve. <u>Safeguarding updates – Online Safety</u>

With half term upon us, I thought it relevant to share some handy tips for parents when it comes to managing children's screen time and helping them to access age-appropriate content.

If you are worried about the amount of time your child spends in front of a screen or are looking at ways to manage screen time, Internet Matters have produced a great video with suggestions. You can view this <u>here</u>.

The internet is a public and open space where anyone can post and share content. This can be fun and entertaining for children, but it does mean your child may see something that is intended for adults. Find out what to do if <u>you're worried your child might see something inappropriate online</u> or what to do <u>if they</u> already have.

Children love to watch videos and YouTube is always a firm favourite! But sometimes children can be exposed to videos that are not meant for them. <u>YouTube Kids</u> is a safer way for children to explore their interests.
